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At the City Council Study Session on September 15, 2014, staff will be providing an update on Public Safety items.

### **Police Department**

**RE:** 212<sup>th</sup> Way SE Road Stabilization Project

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Staff will be providing a status report on the 212<sup>th</sup> Way SE Road Stabilization (aka Snake Hill Road) project. The City hired Gray and Osborne earlier this year to prepare a preliminary design report and a detailed construction estimate and schedule. This briefing will present the work to date, including a conceptual design, initial construction estimate and schedule.

### **Background**

212th Way SE is one of the three main southern routes used to access the plateau. The original road was constructed poorly with an inadequately compacted roadway base. Past engineering analyses of the roadway have determined that catastrophic failure of the road is not likely. However, the road embankment will continue to shift and slide, gradually requiring significant re-occurring maintenance of the pavement, roadside ditches, and guardrail until the loosely compacted soils can be replaced or stabilized.
