Adopt-A-Road Routes Available!

Are you looking for an easy, on-going volunteer opportunity? We have several roads available for adoption to local groups, organizations and businesses. Upon signing an agreement and meeting initial requirements, organizations will have a nameplate installed on their adopted route. Initial requirements: 1) minimum of two participants 2) must sign an agreement 3) must first host two events to receive a nameplate and then host two events each year to retain nameplate. Roads are available on first come, first served basis. If all routes are full, you will be placed on the waitlist.


